

1st, 1920, file with the Board of Examiners, care Workmen's Compensation Board, St. John, N. B., an application for a certificate to operate stationary or hoisting engines and boilers carrying a pressure of more than fifteen pounds.

Regulation 2.—Candidates for examination are required—

- (a) To be at least eighteen years of age.
- (b) To furnish information as to the length of practical experience as an engineer, assistant fireman, personally or otherwise under the supervision of a competent engineer.
- (c) To satisfy the Board as to character and sobriety.

Regulation 3.—All certificates of license issued for operating stationary or hoisting engines and boilers carrying 15 lbs. pressure shall issue as of the date of January 1st, 1921, and shall remain and continue in effect until December 31st, 1921.

Regulation 4.—All licenses issued to stationary or hoisting engineers or persons having charge of boilers carrying a pressure of more than fifteen pounds, shall be renewed annually and such renewals bear date as of the first day of January of the year of such renewal.

Regulation 5.—Every person in charge of a stationary or hoisting engine or boiler carrying over 15 lbs. pressure must be in possession of a license issued by the Workmen's Compensation Board, and such license must at all times be exposed to view in the engine or boiler room, where the holder thereof is employed, or if impracticable to post, shall be produced on demand.

Regulation 6.—All existing licenses shall be void as of the thirty-first day of December, 1920, and must be renewed as required in Regulation 4.

Regulation 7.—All licenses shall be issued subject to the following scale of fees:

Fee for examination, including certificate if granted	\$5.00
Fee for re-examination or renewal with certificate if granted (all persons licensed under New Brunswick Factories Act, 1905 or otherwise)	2.00
Fee for annual renewal	1.50
Fee for permit as provided by Act	2.00

Regulation 8.—Licenses are subject to cancellation:

- (a) If the holder is habitually intemperate or addicted to the use of drugs.
- (b) If he becomes insane or physically incapacitated.
- (c) If he has proved incompetent or grossly negligent in the discharge of his duties.
- (d) If he has obtained certificate through misrepresentation or fraud.
- (e) If he allows another to operate under his certificate.

Regulation 9.—Examinations of candidates shall be held at the office of the Workmen's Compensation Board, St. John, N. B., in the months of January, April, May and October in each and every year, on a date to be fixed by the Board of Examiners.

(a) The Board of Examiners, if they deem it expedient, may hold additional examinations and may change the place of holding such examination from St. John to any point in the Province that they deem best, provided that examinations of candidates shall be held in Woodstock, Moncton and Bathurst at least once a year if any candidates apply for examinations to be held at any such places.

Regulation 10.—The Board of Examiners shall be allowed the sum of \$10.00 per day and necessary expenses for each day actually engaged in examining candidates for licenses or in performance of other duties required by the Act.

Regulation 11.—Every person operating a stationary or hoisting engine or boiler of over 15 lbs. pressure without a license to operate from the Workmen's Compensation Board, and every person employing him or allowing him to be employed, shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$25.00 or more than \$100.00.

Regulation 12.—Examinations shall consist of questions upon the construction and operation of steam engines, boilers, pumps and hydraulics, and other matters as deemed necessary by Board of Examiners. Candidates may be required to demonstrate practical knowledge of the operation of steam plant in an engine or boiler room. In the event of a candidate failing in his examination, ninety days shall elapse before he shall become eligible for re-examination.
