

LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

COLLEGE BRIDGE CONSTRUCTION COMPANY, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the twenty-ninth day of July, A. D. 1926, incorporating J. Alfred Gaudet, Doctor of Medicine; Emery LeBlanc, Merchant, and Simeon Melanson, Farmer, all of College Bridge, in the Parish of Dorchester, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To enter into the business of purchasing, selling, and dealing in gravel, stone, sand and such other material as is used in the construction of roads and streets.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire real estate, gravel pits or deposits and cement deposits and such other material as may be mixed therewith, and to blast, dig up, excavate and remove the same, and to sell and dispose of the same.
