SUPPLEMENTARY LETTERS PATENT

NEW BRUNSWICK POWER COMPANY.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Supplementary Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Pro-
