GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

1. The Committee of the Executive Council have had under consideration Section 202 of the Act of Assembly 6 George V., Chapter 20, cited as the Intoxicating Liquor Act, 1916, whereby it is provided:

After the declaration of peace consequent upon the termination of the present war, and after this Act shall have been in force and operation for a sufficient length of time to enable its efficiency to be tested, it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council to appoint a day for the holding of an election for or against the retention of the said Act in the Municipalities subject thereto, and all the provisions of the New Brunswick Elections Act, 1916, shall be applicable to such election so far as may be.

2. And the Act of Assembly 9 George V., Chapter 53, whereby said Section 202 was amended by adding thereto the following sub-section:

(1) The Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council may at such election submit such questions as may be deemed advisable to be voted on at such election; and now recommends as follows:

3. That there be submitted to the vote of the electors of the Province of New Brunswick the following questions:

FOR Provincial Prohibition Act	
AGAINST Provincial Prohibition Act.	
FOR Sale of Light Wines and Beers under Government Control.	
AGAINST Sale of Light Wines and Beers.	

4. That Saturday, the 10th day of July, A. D. 1920, be proclaimed as the day on which the voting shall take place.

5. That the said proclamation be published in the Royal Gazette until the voting has taken place.
