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LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

"THE NORTHERN LIGHT, LIMITED."

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of October, A. D. 1920, incorporating Ethelbert McLean, Superintendent; Claude M. Mercereau, publisher, and Clovis T. Richard, Barrister, all of the Town of Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To print, publish, circulate, conduct and sell newspapers, journals, reviews, periodicals, pamphlets, magazines, books, advertisements, to carry on the business of publishers, printers, binders, lithographers, embossers, stationers and die stampers.

To buy, and sell advertising space or privileges and to acquire and operate franchises for the purpose of advertising or for the buying and selling of advertising privileges and generally to carry on a general advertising business; to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in every kind and description of sign, show-card, novelty, label, name plate, badge, calendar or other device, and generally in specialties of all kinds to be used in advertising for commercial and other purposes; to act as special agents for news syndicate, publishers and printers; to acquire by purchase or otherwise and dispose of the copyright of any book, article or other printed matter; to manufacture, buy, sell, lease or dispose of ready prints, patent plates, bases, type, printing machinery or any other goods or property the acquiring, dealing in or disposal of which may be incidental to the business of publishing and printing; by the name of "The Northern Light, Limited," with a capital stock of twenty-four thousand dollars, divided into one hundred and twenty common shares

of one hundred dollars par value and one hundred and twenty preference shares of one hundred dollars each, under the following terms and conditions: The holders of such preference shares shall be entitled to receive out of the profits of the company a cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of eight per centum per annum on the capital for the time being paid up on such shares respectively. Whenever the profits of the Company in respect of any year shall be more than sufficient to pay the preferential dividend aforesaid to the close of such year and also such dividend which may be declared for such year on the common or ordinary shares, the holders of the preference shares shall be entitled to participate in the surplus *pari passu* with the holders of the other shares. In the event of the winding up of the Company, the holders of the preferential shares shall be entitled to have the surplus assets applied first in paying off the capital paid upon the preference shares held by them respectively; secondly, in paying off the arrears (if any) of the preferential dividend aforesaid to the commencement of the winding up, and thereafter to participate ratably with the holders of other shares in the residue (if any) of such surplus assets which shall remain after paying off the capital paid upon such other shares. The said preference shares shall also confer the rights as regards the right of voting at any meeting of the Company, as the ordinary or common shares, and shall also qualify any person to be a director of the Company or to hold any other office. Of the capital stock of the company only 60 shares of the common or ordinary shares and 60 of the preference shares will be issued, and no shares may be sold, issued or allotted without the authorization of three-fourths of the shareholders; with the head office at the Town of Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester and Province of New Brunswick.
