

To buy, sell, trade in and carry on the business of dealers in automobiles, cycles, bicycles, tricycles, motors, engines, carriages, aeroplanes, hydroplanes and conveyances of all kinds and in all articles used in the construction thereof and automobile accessories, equipment and appliances and as a repairer of automobiles and all fuels, lubricants, accessories, tools, equipment and appliances used in connection therewith.

To carry on the business of machinists.
