To carry on a general contracting business in all its branches.

To own and operate hotels, theatres, places of amusement, develop and operate summer resorts, and to do any and all things incidental thereto.

To acquire by purchase, hire, or otherwise, patents, patent rights, brevets d'invention, or any interest therein, and to sell or otherwise deal with the same.
