OPEN SEASON FOR PARTRIDGE

Crown Land Office,
July 26th, 1921.

Under authority of Section 13 of Chapter 12, Acts of Assembly, 11 George V, 1921, "The Game Act" and in accordance with the Order-in-Council of July 5th, 1921, it shall be lawful to hunt, take, shoot or otherwise kill partridge in any part of the Province, provided, however that during such open season no person shall hunt, take, shoot or otherwise kill more than six partridge in any one day or more than twenty partridge during such open season, which open season will begin the first day of October and end the 20th day of October, (both days inclusive,) 1921.
