NOTICE

1. Persons other than barristers and attorneys, duly admitted as such in this Province, desirous of being appointed Notaries Public shall present a petition to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council by filing the same with the Clerk of the Executive Council.

2. Such petition shall set forth the age, place of birth, residence and educational qualifications of such person, and shall be accompanied by a certificate of two reputable business men of the place where the applicant proposes to act as a Notary, that they believe the petitioner to be a proper person and properly qualified to be appointed to the office of Notary Public, and that a Notary is needed for the public convenience in the place where the petitioner intends to practice.

3. Upon the petition being approved by the Attorney General the petitioner shall undergo an examination before the Attorney General, or some person appointed to act for him, at such time and place as he may appoint, by written questions and answers, or viva voce questions and answers, or both, as the Attorney General may direct to.

4. Upon the petitioner passing such examination to the satisfaction of the Attorney General, the Attorney General shall recommend the appointment to the Governor-in-Council.

5. Each applicant, upon filing his petition with the Clerk of the Executive Council, shall at the same time deposit with him the sum of ten dollars, to pay the cost of the examination, if granted. If the Attorney General does not approve of such petition and grant an examination, the said sum so deposited shall be returned to the applicant.

THE FEES to be taken upon the incorporation of companies by letters patent under the New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916, section 17, sub-section (2) for charitable, philanthropic, temperance, religious, social, literary, educational or other like purposes, where there is no capital stock and where the cost value of the real and personal property specified under section 17, sub-section 2, paragraph E, shall be as follows:

Where the cost value does not exceed \$1,000.00, a fee of \$10.00.

Over \$1,000.00 and under \$2,000.00, a fee of \$15.00.

Over \$2,000.00 and under \$3,000.00 a fee of \$20.00.

Over \$3,000.00 and under \$4,000.00 a fee of \$25.00.

Over \$4,000.00 and under \$5,000.00 a fee of \$30.00.

And for \$5,000.00 and upwards the same fee shall be charged as for trading companies. Also that the fee for one insertion in the Royal Gazette of the notice of granting letters patent shall be \$2.20 per square.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Thirteenth day of July, A. D. 1921, incorporating Arthur W. McInnes, Clerk, J. Pith Brittain, Coal Merchant, both of the City of Saint John in the County of the City and County of Saint John in the Province of New Brunswick; and Urban V. Caulfield, Station Agent, of Grand Bay in the County of Kings and Province aforesaid for the following purposes namely:

To establish, maintain and conduct a club for the promotion and playing of the game of golf, tennis and other lawful games and for social and athletic purposes and to develop field and water sports and recreations of all kinds and to provide club-houses, buildings, links courts, boats, canoes, yachts, motor boats, steamers, wharves, landings, lands, premises and other conveniences for the accommodation of members of the Club and their friends and of the servants and employees of the Club and generally to afford the members of the Club and their friends all the usual privileges, advantages, conveniences and accommodations of a Club for such purposes.

To take an active interest in the social welfare and good of the community and to provide in any way for the recreation and mutual improvement and pleasure thereby of the members of the Association.

wise acquire any lands, buildings, easements or property real and personal which may be requisite for the purposes of or capable of being used in connection with any of the objects of the Club and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of such property and for the purposes of the Club to Mortgage the real estate or otherwise raise moneys.

To borrow money and to make, draw take, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, debentures, agreements of sale and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To pass and adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may deem necessary respecting the admission and exclusion of members, the classification and the respective rights and privileges of such members, the fees, subscriptions and dues which it may deem advisable to impose, the number constitution powers and duties of its officers and of its committee of management and generally for the administration and management of its affairs and provide for the imposition of penalties by way of suspension or forfeiture of membership for the breach or nonobservance thereof and alter or repeal all or any of such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may see fit, and also delegate to its committee of management all or any of its powers of passing, adopting, altering and repealing such by-laws, rules and regulations.
