The Lease may be terminated by the Minister at any time on one year's notice on payment of improvements and for buildings, plant and machinery, if the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council is of the opinion that the property is required by the Crown in the public interest.

Likely and the Provincial Fertilizer Company, Limited, on the eastern shore of Courtenay Bay; thence running by the magnet of the year 1914, south 20 degrees
