LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

MONCTON WHOLESALE GROCERS, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the fifteenth day of April, A. D. 1921, incorporating Ephraim A. Schoch, Accountant, of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, in the Province of New Brunswick; George Albert Steeves, Farmer, of Upper Dover in the Parish of Moncton, in the County and Province aforesaid; V. Kathleen Steeves, Spinster; Minnie A. Steeves, wife of J. Frederick Steeves, and J. Frederick Steeves, Merchant, all of the City of Moncton, in the County and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes namely:

To acquire by purchase or otherwise as a going concern, the business now carried on at Moncton, in the Province of New Brunswick, by J. Frederick Steeves, and to continue the said business together with its plant, supplies, stock in trade, license, good will and other movable or immovable assets generally used in the operation of such business, and to pay for such acquisition either wholly or partly in cash or in bonds or fully paid-up shares of this Company.

To carry on generally and in all its branches, either as principals or agents, the business of importers, exporters, manufacturers and dealers in groceries, food products of all kinds, chemicals and pharmaceutical products, patent medicines, together with all other kinds of merchandise which this company may deem expedient to deal with or represent, or calculated to enhance in any way the value of or render profitable its property.

To carry on business as manufacturer of, shipper and dealer in all kinds of canned goods, including lobsters, clams, scallops, salmon, and all kinds of fish, vegetables, pickles, condiments, sauces, jams, jellies, preserves, table delicacies, grocers' sundries and supplies and prepared goods and to carry on the business of a packing house in all its branches, and to pack, cure, smoke, preserve, can, bottle and prepare for consumption and use, and to buy, sell and deal in all and any products of fish, poultry, game, cattle and other animals and all the by-products thereof.

To carry on the business of fish, vegetable, fruit, meat and general supply merchants, butchers, grocers and general provision merchants and dealers.

To acquire by purchase or otherwise, to erect, lease, hold, operate manufacturing stores, warehouses or other property movable or immovable which may be deemed necessary for the Company's interests, and to sell, lease, replace, exchange or otherwise dispose of the same in any manner deemed advisable by the Company.

To acquire, maintain, operate and carry on refrigeration plants, cold storage warehouses and to preserve and pack provisions of all kinds.

To enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing of profits, union of interests, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any person or company carrying on or engaged in, or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which the Company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To lend money to, guarantee the contracts of, or otherwise assist any such person or company, and to take or otherwise acquire shares and securities of any such company, and to sell, hold, re-issue with or without guarantee or otherwise deal with the same.

Subject to Section 49 of the said Companies Act, to take or otherwise acquire

and hold shares in any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company, or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To promote any company or companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the property and liabilities of the Company, or for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly calculated to benefit the Company.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any personal property and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business and in particular any machinery, plant and stock-in-trade.

To lend money to customers and others having dealings with the company, and to guarantee the performance of contracts by any such persons.

To draw, make, accept, endorse, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants, and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To do all or any of the above things and all things authorized by the letters patent or supplementary letters patent as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

To acquire, take over or amalgamate with other firms or companies carrying on a similar line of business or industry.

To lease, sell or otherwise dispose of the real and personal property and assets of the Company or any part thereof, for such consideration as the directors of the Company may deem fit, including shares, debentures or securities of any other company.

To allot fully paid up shares for any property or business acquired by the Company.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake and assume any part of the assets or business of any other company or party or firm similar to that which this Company is authorized to carry on or allied thereto; by the name of "Moncton Wholesale Grocers, Limited," with a capital stock of forty-nine thousand dollars divided into four hundred and ninety shares of one hundred dollars, with the head office at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.
