Ottawa, 22nd Oct., 1921.

Sir,— I have the honour to inform you that His Excellency the Governor-General has received a telegraphic despatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated the 13th October, 1921, proposing that on November the 11th—Armistice Day—there should be a complete suspension of all normal business, as far as possible, beginning at 11 a. m. and continuing for the space of two minutes.

The Canadian Government has adopted this suggestion, and in accordance therewith, on Friday, the 11th of November next, beginning at 11 o'clock a. m., all normal business will be suspended for the space of two minutes.

I am directed to bring the subject to your attention, and to acquaint you with the desire of the Government in the premises.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-eighth day of October, A. D., 1921, incorporating Allan E. Hammond, Lumberman; Wilfred J. Sirois, Foreman; both of Van Buren in the County of Aroostook in the State of Maine, one of the United States of America; Chester C. Whitney, Lumberman; and Frank L. Perry, Lumberman; both of the City of Boston in the State of Massachusetts, one of the United States of America for the following purposes namely:

To engage in and carry on the business of lumbermen and saw-millers and of buying, selling and dealing in timber and woods, timber limits and wood lands and licenses, and of manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in lumber, pulp-wood, ties, laths, shingles, and other wood products and extracts and essences and other articles in the making of which timber or wood is required or can be utilized.

To acquire by purchase, lease, license contract or otherwise any water powers and lands on which water power may be developed and rights to develop and utilize water powers and to utilize the same for any and all purposes.

To construct, acquire and operate lines of telegraph, or telephone or other means of communication on lands owned or controlled by the company and for the purpose of the Company only.

For the purpose of the Company to buy, sell, manufacture and deal in goods, wares and merchandise, both wholesale and retail, and to construct and acquire, operate and manage hotels and boarding and lodging houses.
