4. Upon the petitioner passing such examination to the satisfaction of the Attorney General, the Attorney General shall recommend the appointment to the Governor-in-Council.

Each applicant, upon filing his petition with the Clerk of the Executive Council, shall deposit with him the sum of ten dollars, to pay the cost of the examination, if granted; the Attorney General does not approve such petition and grant an examination, the said sum so deposited shall be returned to the applicant.
