LOANS TO TEACHERS

THE Board of Education of the Province of New Brunswick, beginning September, 1921, will loan money to students who possess the necessary academic standing for admission, and who require financial assistance to enable them to complete the Normal School Courses.

The maximum amount loaned to any

of Fifty Dollars (\$50) per month during 15 in each year.

The loan will be repayable over three (3) years (half-yearly) with interest, the first payment to be made six (8) months | Education Office, April 20th, 1921. after graduation.

A condition will be imposed upon those agree to teach in New Brunswick for three years and until such time as the loan is repaid.

The first meeting will probably last for two days.
