To purphase, take on, lease, hire or otherwise acquire and hold lands or water lots or any interest therein for the purposes of hunting and fishing, together with other easements, rights and privi-leges whatspevr for the purposes of the Company.

To sell, improve, manage, develop, exchange, lease, dispose of, turn to ac-count or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.

To pass and adopt such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may deem necessary for the admission and expulsion of members the classification and the respective rights and privileges of such members, the fees, subscriptions and dues which it may deem advisable to impose, the number, constitution powers and duties of its officers and of its committee of management and generally for the administration and management of the administration and management of its affairs and provide for the imposition of penalties by way of suspension or forfeiture of membership for the breach or non observance thereof and alter or repeal all or any of such by-laws, rules and regulations as it may see fit, and also

chase, gift, bequest or otherwise in trust for the objects and purposes of the Com-

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in con-junction with others. To do all such other things as are in-

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, by the name of "Micmac Sporting Club, Limited," with a capital stock of Two Thousand nine hundred dollars divided into Twenty-nine shares of One hundred dollars each, and with the head office at the Town of Bathurst in the County of Gloucester in the Province of New Brunswick.

The shares of the capital stock of the Club shall not be transferable to any person not then being a member of and shareholder in the Club, until the name of the proposed transferee or member

of the proposed transferee or member has been first submitted for the approval of the existing shareholders or members as may be prescribed by the by-law of the Club; and provided also for the removal of the name of any member from the Company register, upon the approval of two-thirds of the members of
