1. Persons other than barristers and attorneys, duly admitted as such in this Province, desirous of being appointed Notaries Public shall present a petition to the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council by filing the same with the Clerk of the Executive Council.

2. Such petition shall set forth the age, place of birth, residence and educational qualifications of such person, and shall be accompanied by a certificate of two reputable business men of the place

where the applicant proposes to act as a Notary, that they believe the petitioner to be a proper person and properly qualified to be appointed to the office of Notary Public, and that a Notary is needed for the public convenience in the place where the petitioner intends to practice.

3. Upon the petition being approved by the Attorney General the petitioner shall undergo an examination before the Attorney General, or some person appointed to act for him, at such time and place as he may appoint, by written questions and answers, or viva voce questions and answers, or both, as the Attorney General may direct to.

4. Upon the petitioner passing such examination to the satisfaction of the Attorney General, the Attorney General shall recommend the appointment to the Governor-in-Council.

5. Each applicant, upon filing his petition with the Clerk of the Executive Council, shall at the same time deposit with him the sum of ten dollars, to pay the cost of the examination, if granted. (The Attorney General does not approve of such petition and grant an examination, the said sum so deposited shall be returned to the applicant.)
