

qualified to be appointed to the office of Notary Public, and that a Notary is needed for the public convenience in the place where the petitioner intends to practice.

3. Upon the petition being approved by the Attorney General the petitioner shall undergo an examination before the Attorney General, or some person appointed to act for him, at such time and place as he may appoint, by written questions and answers, or viva voce questions and answers, or both, as the Attorney General may direct to.

4. Upon the petitioner passing such examination to the satisfaction of the Attorney General, the Attorney General shall recommend the appointment to the Governor-in-Council.

5. Each applicant, upon filing his petition with the Clerk of the Executive Council, shall at the same time deposit with him the sum of ten dollars, to pay the cost of the examination, if granted. If the Attorney General does not approve of such petition and grant an examination, the said sum so deposited shall be returned to the applicant.

OPEN SEASON FOR PARTRIDGE

Crown Land Office,
July 20th, 1921.

Under authority of Section 13 of Chapter 12, Acts of Assembly, 11 George V, 1921, "The Game Act" and in accordance with the Order-in-Council of July 5th, 1921, it shall be lawful to hunt, take shoot or otherwise kill partridge in any part of the Province, provided, however that during such open season no person shall hunt, take, shoot or otherwise kill more than six partridge in any one day or more than twenty partridge during such open season, which open season will begin the first day of October and end the 20th day of October, (both days inclusive,) 1921.
