CANADA

GEORGE the FIFTH by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, KING, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

To all to whom these presents shall come, or whom the same may in anywise concern, GREETING:—

A PROCLAMATION

E. L. NEWCOMBE Whereas it hath pleased Almighty God in his great goodness to vouchsafe this year unto Our Dominion of Canada a bountiful harvest and other blessings,—

We therefore considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgement, have thought fit by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada to appoint and We do appoint Armistice Day, Monday the seventh day of November next, as a day of general thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of general thanksgiving.

Of all which Our loving subjects and all others whom these presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

In Testimony Whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness, Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Julian Hedworth George, Baron Byng of Vimy, General on the Retired List and in the Reserve of Officers of Our Army, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Member of Our Royal Victorian Order, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this twelfth day of October in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one and in the twelfth year of Our Reign.

Sir,— I have the honour to inform you that His Excellency the Governor-General has received a telegraphic despatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated the 13th October, 1921, proposing that on November the 11th—Armistice Day—there should be a complete suspension of all normal business, as far as possible, beginning at 11 a. m. and continuing for the space of two minutes.

The Canadian Government has adopted this suggestion, and in accordance therewith, on Friday, the 11th of November next, beginning at 11 o'clock a. m., all normal business will be suspended for the space of two minutes.

I am directed to bring the subject to your attention, and to acquaint you with the desire of the Government in the premises.
