HIS HONOUR the Lieutenant-Governor directs the publication of the following for general publication:

### CANADA

Department of the Secretary of State

Ottawa, 22nd Oct., 1921.

Sir,—I have the honour to inform you that His Excellency the Governor-General has received a telegraphic despatch from the Secretary of State for the Colonies, dated the 13th October, 1921,

proposing that on November the 11th—Armistice Day—there should be a complete suspension of all normal business, as far as possible, beginning at 11 a. m. and continuing for the space of two minutes.

The Canadian Government has adopted this suggestion, and in accordance therewith, on Friday, the 11th of November next, beginning at 11 o'clock a. m., all normal business will be suspended for the space of two minutes.

I am directed to bring the subject to your attention, and to acquaint you with the desire of the Government in the premises.
