"BARNES OYSTER COMPANY, LIMITED."

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the First day of November, A. D. 1921, incorporating James Barnes, Farmer; James Barnes, Junior, Farmer; Edward D. Barnes, Farmer; all of Buctouche in the County of Kent, in the Province of New Brunswick; and Frank Arthur McCully, Barrister at Law, of the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:
