NOTICE TO LABOUR ACT COMMISSIONERS, AND SETTLERS ON CROWN LANDS.

The following order-in-council was passed on December 13, 1921.

"In accordance with the requirements of Section 2, Chapter 29, Consolidated Statutes, 1903, permission is hereby granted to all applicants of lots of Crown Land not already under timber license under Chapter 25, respecting the Settlement of Crown Lands, commonly known as the "Labour Act", to cut and carry away free of stumpage all burnt and bud worm killed lumber on the lots of land "approved" to them in the Royal Gazette, provided that the applicant is bona fide carrying out the terms of the "Labour Act" in actually making his homestead on the lot within the meaning of the Act, and having no other permanent residence, also provided that such right is subject to the inspection of the Department of Lands and Mines as to the right of the settler to cut and carry away the said lumber under the above conditions.

This regulation to be in force till December 31, 1922."
