Fredericton, April 13th, 1922.

This day at nine p. m. His Honour William Pugsley, D. C. L., LL. D., K. C., P. C., Lieutenant Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, came to the Assembly Chamber and being seated on the Throne after assenting to the several bills passed during the session, was pleased to close the session with the following speech.

SPEECH

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of The Legislative Assembly:

I thank you for the earnest attention which you have given to the general business of the Session as well as to the many important matters which I have, from time to time, submitted to you.

Important Acts affecting the business, industrial and social life of the Province, have been submitted to you for consideration, and I am pleased to direct special attention to the Acts providing pensions and disability allowances to the public school teachers and officials; Incorporation of Associations for Co-Operative Marketing; to the Women's Institutes and for the re-organization of the Maritime Farmers' Co-Operative Company, which affects so many of our agricultural people; for the consolidation of the Public School Acts; for the amendments of Highway and Motor Vehicle Laws; for the provision of new permanent bridges; for extension and construction of the Hydro Electric transmission lines from St. John to Moncton; for the amendments to the Public Health Act giving the Municipal Councils a larger voice in the appointments of Boards of Health; for important amendments improving the protection of the Crown Lands from forest fires, and affecting many other matters are greatly concerned.

I thank you for the provision which you have made for the important Public Services of the Province, and in now relieving you of public and private interest in which the people of the Province from further attendance upon your Legislative duties, I desire to extend to all of you my earnest wish for your individual prosperity and happiness.
