PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty eighth day of April, A. D. 1922, incorporating George E. McCall, Plumber; Joseph P. Wood, Insurance Agent; and Beatrice Crawford, Stenographer; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern, the business now carried on at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, by George E. McCall, as an Electrician and Plumber and all assets and liabilities of the said George E. McCall in connection therewith with the undertaking and good-will thereof, and all the rights and contracts now held by the said George E. McCall in connection therewith, subject to the obligations affecting the same, and to pay for the same in paid-up shares of this Company.

To carry on the respective business of plumbers, manufacturers, contractors for plumbing and sanitary fixtures and supplies, heating, and ventilating, plant and supplies, pipes, fittings, apparatus and repairs for heat, light, gas or water supplies, general contractors and builders.
