In any County where no newspaper may be published, the Bill, in lieu of other local publications, may be read at any Circuit or County Court in the gressence of the Grand Jury, or before the Manicipal Council of the County interested in or affected by the Bill, and a certificate of such reading shall be indonsed thereon, or attached to the said Bill, by the Clerk of the Court, or the Town Clerk or the Secretary-Treasurer, as the case may be, verified by the Seal (if any) of the Court, Town Council or Municipal Council, as the case may be; and a petition must be presented to the House setting forth in detail the object of the measure, and the reasons that may be urged for its adoption.

86. 'II. It shall be the duty of all parties seeking the interference of the legislature in any Private Bill, to file with the Clerk of this House the evidence of their having complied with the Rules and Standing Orders thereof.

82. In default of such proof or evi-cence being so furnished, it shall be the duty of the Clerk to report to Mr. Speaker, or the House, and to indorse upon the Bill that the Rules and Standing Orders have not been complied with.

Upon Incorporation of Companies having a stated capital, or amendments increasing capital, an additional fee equal to the fee payable under the N. B. Joint Stock Company's Act.
