PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Eighteenth day of March, A. D. 1922, incorporating Amos John McLaggan, Miller; Dora Winifred McLaggan, wife of the said Amos John McLaggan; both of South Devon in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; and Winnifred Weldon Upham, Stenographer; of the City of Saint John in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase and acquire the cornmeal mill, property, lands, buildings, leases, machinery, plant and premises owned by Amos John McLaggan and the business carried on by him in South Devon under the name, style and firm of Royal Mills, with all the goods, chattels, franchises,

assets and effects owned by him in connection with the said business.
