## LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

### "SUTHERLANDS LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Ninth day of June, A. D. 1922, incorporating Roderick Henry Sutherland, Merchant; Daniel Hugh Sutherland, Merchant; and George A. Robertson, Merchant; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, take over or otherwise acquire as a going concern the business now carried on at the City of Moncton, in the Province of New Brunswick, by "Sutherland Brothers" and all or any of the assets and liabilities of the proprietors of that business in connection therewith with the undertaking and good-will thereof, and all the rights and contracts now held by the proprietors subject to the obligations, if any, affecting the same, and to pay for the same in cash or in paid-up shares of this Company.

To carry on the business of wholesale and retail grocers, foodstuffs, grain and provision merchants, in all branches, and the business of importing and exporting all products used or dealt with in any such business.

To purchase, manufacture, prepare, buy, sell, import, export and otherwise deal in all goods, wares and merchandise such as builders' hardware, shelf hardware, kitchenware, paint, varnish, oils, gasoline, ready roofing, tinware, agate-ware, aluminum ware, tools, cutlery, glass tenaces thereto, stove, grates, furnaces, electrical goods, fixtures and all apparatus ranges, cement, machinery, farm implements, tractors, trucks, motors, automobiles and automobile accessories, gasoline engines and other articles used in connection therewith, sewer pipes, terra cotta and all other products of clay, sand or cement.

To conduct a general plumbing and heating and sheet metal business and to manufacture, import, sell and deal in plumbing, heating, engineering and water works supplies.

To buy, sell, make, manufacture, import, export, warehouse, store and deal in steel, iron, metals, metallic combinations, coal, iron, stone and other metals, articles, goods, wares or merchandise and to carry on all or any of the trades or businesses of steel manufacturers, iron masters, smelting engineers, iron founders, manufacturers of files, plates, forgings (both rolled and hammered) castings, swords, bayonets, saws, edge tools, hammers, shovels, springs, tires, conicals, volutes, anvils, vices, forges, jacks, tuffers, mining tools, railway and contractors' tools, steel wire, rope, hardeners, temperers, coal masters or owners, quarrymen, brick and tile makers, coke makers, coal, coke, stone, clay and brick contractors and merchants and wagon builders, and manufacturers of articles or things either wholly or partly made of any metals or of any combination of any metal or metals in all or any of their respective branches, and any other trade or business in any way connected with any of the said businesses or premises.

To manufacture, refine, purchase, sell and deal in glycerine, shellac, varnish,

soap, candles, perfumes, toilet articles, oils, oleaginous and saponaceous articles, unguents, pharmaceutical, medicinal, chemical, industrial and other preparations and articles and such other products and by-products as are incidental thereto.

To carry on the business of manufacturing, storing, shipping, vending and dealing in cement of all kinds and all articles into which cement enters or forms a component part, and to dig, mine or otherwise produce earth, marl, clay, stone, shale, granite or other minerals, necessary for the manufacture of cement and other products, aforesaid.

To carry on the business of manufacturers of and dealers in brick of all kinds, terra cotta, tiles, drain and sewer pipes, cement, marl, lime, paints, fertilizers, stone and artificial stone, and in products and all compositions into which any of the said articles and materials can be converted or used, and to erect buildings and buy, sell and deal in building material of all kinds, and for the said purposes.

To construct, carry out, maintain, improve, manage, work, control and superintend any factories, warehouses, shops, dwelling houses and other works and conveniences which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to or convenient for any of the purposes and objects of the Company, and to contribute to subsidize or otherwise aid or take part in any such operation.

To acquire, manufacture, buy, sell, and supply light, heat and power of every description with the aid of steam, gas, electricity and other aids, and to sell and transmit the same to others and make such agreements and contracts and to incur such expenditures and undertake such work and to do all other things on behalf of the Company necessary for the acquisition, manufacture, use, sale, and other disposition thereof, subject to all local and municipal regulations in that behalf.

To buy, sell, and supply crockery and glassware, in all its branches, electric fixtures, appliances and equipment in all its branches.

To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire any trade marks, patents, licenses, concessions and the like conferring any exclusive or non-exclusive or limited right to use, or any secret or other information as to any invention which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the Company, or the acquisition of which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to benefit the Company, and to use, exercise, develop or grant licenses in respect of or otherwise turn to account the property, rights or information so acquired.

To develop and turn to account any land acquired by the Company or in which it is interested and in particular by laying out and preparing the same for building purposes, constructing, altering, pulling down, decorating, maintaining, fitting up and improving buildings and conveniences and by planting, paving, farming, cultivating, letting on building lease or building agreement and by advancing money to and entering into contracts and arrangements of all kinds with builders, tenants and others.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business property and liabilities of any person or Company carrying on any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the Company, and to pay therefore in fully paid-up or partly paid-up preferences or ordinary shares of the Company or in the bonds debentures or other securities of the Company.

To enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing of profits, union of interests, partnership, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any person or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which the Company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To lend money to guarantee the contracts of, or otherwise assist any such

person or company and to sell, hold, re-issue without or with guarantee or otherwise deal with the same.

To take or otherwise acquire, own, or dispose of shares in the capital stock or the bonds, obligations or other securities of any Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company or carrying on any business capable of being conducted so as to directly or indirectly benefit this Company, or possessed of any property, rights or franchises capable of being used so as to directly or indirectly benefit this Company or enhance the value of its undertakings (notwithstanding the provisions of Section 44 of the Companies' Act), and to guarantee the payment of dividends on any such stock and the payment of the principal of and interest on any such bonds, obligations or other securities, and to aid in any manner any such Company.

To enter into any arrangements with any authorities, supreme, municipal, local or otherwise whether domestic or foreign that may seem conducive to the Company's objects, or any of them and to obtain from any such authority any rights, privileges and concessions which the Company may think is desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.

To establish and support or aid in the establishment and support of associations, institutions, funds, trusts and conveniences calculated to benefit employees or ex-employees of the Company (or its predecessors in business) or the dependents or connections of such persons and to grant pensions and allowances and to make payments towards insurance and to subscribe or guarantee money for charitable or benevolent objects or for any exhibition or for any public, general or useful object.

To promote any Company or Companies for the purpose of acquiring all or any of the property and liabilities of the Company, or for any other purpose which may seem directly or indirectly calculated to benefit the Company.

Generally to purchase, take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any personal property and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business.

For the purposes aforesaid to carry on the business of cartage, warehousing and forwarding for the purposes of the Company.

To sell or dispose of the whole or any part of the assets and undertakings of the Company as a going concern or otherwise, for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, bonds, debentures or securities of any other Company having power to acquire the same.
