A typewritten copy or printed copy of every Private Bill or Local Bill intro-duced into this House shall be filed with the Clerk of the House within ten days after the opening of the Session, and in case of failure to comply with this pro-vision, the fee on the introduction of any such Private Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Puls 84 and the factor of the fee such Private Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule 84, applicable to such Bill, and Local Bills introduced after ten days of the opening of the Session shall pay the same fee as a Private Bill. 78. No Private Bill, or Bill making an amendment of a like nature to a for-mer Act, shall be received by the House unless a notice specify and dis

unless a notice specifying clearly and disunless a notice specifying clearly and us-tinctly, the nature and objects thereof, has been published four successive weeks previous to the meeting of the Legisla-ture, or to the introduction of the Bill in some one of the newspapers published paper is published in such county or lo-cality, then in some newspaper having general circulation in such County or locality, and also in the Royal Gazette. and in the parties affected reside, is largely composed of a French population, then such no-tice shall also be published in a French newspaper, if any be published in the Province.
