

Town of Devon in the County and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes, namely:

To hold Exhibitions and to exhibit any and every variety of thing and being found in animal and vegetable life.

To exhibit wares, goods, merchandise machinery, mechanical inventions and improvements of every nature, name and kind and industrial, agricultural, horticultural, domestic and other products, either manufactured or grown, or in process of manufacture or growth.

To exhibit paintings, statuary or other works.

To exhibit and develop the points and qualities of the several breeds of horses and other animals by such competition tests as may be humane and proper or as may be deemed expedient and to hold, conduct and carry on fairs, carnivals and other lawful entertainments in the City of Fredericton.

To lay out and prepare grounds and other places for riding, driving and horse racing or for any athletic sports, games or competitions.

To construct houses, grand stands, paddocks, stables, refreshment rooms and other buildings and conveniences, either permanent or temporary.

To conduct, hold and promote race meetings.

To encourage, promote and conduct lawful games and exercises in the City of Fredericton in the County of York.

To give and to contribute towards prizes, cups, stakes or other rewards in connection with the Exhibitions, Races or other competitions conducted or promoted by the Company or carried on in or on the Grounds or Buildings of the Company.

To serve refreshments of all kinds to its members or to the Public.

To charge admissions, entrance or other fees as may be deemed proper to receive for exhibiting anything authorized herein or in connection with any competitions, races or games.

To let or lease stalls, stands, rooms and places, in any part of the Companies' buildings, structures or grounds upon such terms and conditions and for such purposes as the Board of Directors may deem best in the interests of the Association.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, land, buildings and real and personal property of all kinds necessary for or incidental to any and all the purposes of the Company.

To sell, lease, mortgage, hypothecate or encumber, in any way, the real or personal property of the Company.

To issue bonds, debentures and other securities secured by mortgage, pledge or hypothecation of all or any of the property of the Company.

To hold all property, both real and personal, and the profits and income arising therefrom, acquired by it by purchase, gift, bequest or otherwise in trust for the objects and purposes for which the Company is incorporated, and that no dividends shall be declared or paid on any Capital Stock of the Company.

That the incorporators and such other persons as shall become and be registered members in accordance with the provisions of the Letters Patent or By-Laws of the Company shall constitute the Company.

That the Company shall cause a list of its members to be kept in a book to be provided for that purpose which shall be known as the Company Registry, and shall at all times during business hours be open to the inspection of all members of the Company.

That the Company may, in the absence of other express provisions therefor in the Letters Patent, make By-Laws to determine the qualification for membership and for the removal of the names of those members who may cease to be qualified. Any person whose name is duly entered on the Company Registry shall be and continue a member until his name is duly removed therefrom pursuant to the provisions of the Letters Patent or By-Laws of the Company. Any member whose name shall be removed from the Registry pursuant to the provisions of the Letters Patent or By-Laws, shall from the date of such removal cease to be a member of the Company.

That the Company shall not carry on any business or trade other than what is

included in the purposes above set out.

The members of the Company shall not as such be liable for any debts or obligations of the Company.

No By-Law of the Company for the removal of the name of any member from the Company Registry shall have any force or effect unless and until approved of by two-thirds of the members of the Company, by the name of "Fredericton Exhibition Limited" with no Capital Stock or issue any share certificates, but the Company may acquire real and personal property to a cost value not exceeding the sum of Ninety nine thousand dollars, and may hold, manage and turn the same to account for the purposes or objects for which the Company is incorporated and may lease, let, mortgage, pledge or sell the same or any part thereof, with the head Office at the City of Fredericton in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick.
