A PROCLAMATION

Goodness to vouchsafe this year unto Our Dominion of Canada, a bountiful harvest and other blessings.

We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout Our said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgement, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do appoint Monday, the sixth day of November next, (Armistice Day) as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all Our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day as a day of General Thanksgiving.

In Testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be

hereunto affixed. Witness: Our Right Trusty and Well Beloved Counsellor, the Right Honourable Sir Louis Henry Davies, one of Our Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Commander of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice of Canada and Deputy of Our Right Trusty and Well-Beloved Julian Hedworth George, Baron Byng of Vimy, General on the Retired List and in the Reserve of Officers of Our Army, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Member of Our Royal Victorian Order, Governor General and Commander-in-Chief of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this twenty-first day of September in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two and in the thirtieth year of Our Reign.
