

otherwise a lot of land on which to erect a community hall in the Parish of Dufferin aforesaid. It being fully understood and agreed by the persons herein named, residents of the said Parish, and other contributors to the said Hall fund, that a lot of land shall be donated and conveyed by a deed of conveyance from Harry Brown and May Lucy Brown, his wife, to the "Good Hope Club, Limited", as soon as they are legally incorporated or within a reasonable time thereafter. All real estate, personal property, etc., to be held by the Company in trust for the objects hereinafter mentioned.

To purchase, own, lease or otherwise acquire and hold other real estate or other property interests necessary or convenient for the carrying out of the objects of the Company. All such property together with the profits and income derived therefrom to be held in trust for the objects and purposes for which the Company may be incorporated.

To erect, furnish, operate and maintain the above-mentioned hall, for the use and benefits of the residents of the said Parish for religious, patriotic, social and recreational purposes, and generally for such public and other uses and purposes as may be deemed expedient and to yield a revenue for the support of the said Hall, or for any public, benevolent, religious or charitable object.

To take over, hold, and enjoy all books, documents, etc., now in possession of what is known as the Good Hope Club or in possession of any of its officers, and which are the property of the last mentioned Society.

To borrow such a sum or sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and equipment of the said Hall, and to give therefor a valid bond or bonds, promissory note or notes with mortgage security on its property real and personal, with terms, provisos, conditions and covenants usual or customary in such securities, provided however, that the sum of Twelve Hundred Dollars shall be the limit as to principal money borrowed for which mortgage security may be given.

To do all things which are incidental or necessary to the carrying out of the aforesaid objects, or which in the opinion of the directors of the said Company may be requisite for the furthering of the proposed objects.

To do all things as set out by Section 17 of "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916", by the name of "Good Hope Club, Limited", with no capital stock and no share certificates will be issued. An amount of eight hundred dollars has already been raised by means of socials, membership fees, subscriptions, etc., The value of the Hall building, land, etc., not to exceed two thousand dollars, with the head Office in the Parish of Dufferin in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick.
