LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

"ST. CROIX RINK, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916 and amendments thereto, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-third day of November, A. D. 1922, incorporating Howard M. Murchie, George H. I. Cockburn, P. Elmer McLaughlin, Melvin C. Buchanan, Fred Boyd, Blair Carson, S. D. Granville, H. R. Haley, Evans Hill, R. Earle Hyslop, Aubrey F. Johnson, D. K. McGeachey, Allen McLean, Frank A. Nicholson, C. A. O'Brien, J. E. Osborne, William J. Porter, Reginald A. Ramsay, Randall J. Webber and Frederick Waterson, all of the Town of Saint Stephen in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of a skating, hockey and curling rink, and to hold carnivals, fairs, bawmers, dances, and assemblies, entertainments and games, and gymnastics of all kinds, and public meetings on the said premises.

To engage in restaurant, confectionery, tobacco and general small wares business on the said premises, and to grant concessions and privileges to others to carry on a restaurant, confectionery, tobacco and small wares business.

To install dynamos and other machinery for the purpose of generating and supplying electric or other light and power for the purposes appertaining or incidental to the business of the Company on the said premises.
