"BIG SEVOGLE FISHING CLUB, LIMITED".

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Seventeenth day of May A. D. 1922, incorporating William Flintoff Humphrey, Manufacturer, of Humphreys Mills in the Parish of Moncton in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; Leverett Herbert Price, Physician; Frederick William Winter, Manager; Bertram Eugene Smith, Merchant; and Frederick Jones, Broker; all of the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland and Province aforesaid, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire and take over a certain lease dated the 22nd. day of March, 1922, between His Majesty the King acting by and through the Minister of Lands and Mines for the Province of New Brunswick of the one part and Frederick William Winter of the other part and to pay for the same or any part thereof in paid-up shares of the Company or for cash.

To acquire by purchase or lease or otherwise sell and dispose of fishing

grounds, lands, streams and premises, fishing rights, privileges, houses, buildings and improvements on the Big Sevoogle River in New Brunswick, and, its branches and other rivers, lakes and waters within the said Province of New Brunswick for the mutual pleasure and recreation of its members and their friends with power to sub-let such rights, and such other things as are incident thereto.

To purchase and otherwise acquire, to pickle, salt, freeze, smoke, cure and otherwise treat, to pack and store, to sell and otherwise dispose of and deal in and with fish and all other products of the seas, rivers and lakes;

To purchase, build, acquire and operate ships, boats and vessels of all kinds, and wharves, piers, flake yards, store-houses and all other kinds of buildings and structures.

To promote, organize, conduct and manage a golf, country and social club, and to promote the welfare of the members thereof, with power to make and adopt a constitution and bye-laws, rules and regulations for the admission, suspension and expulsion of its members, and for their government, and for the establishing of different classes of membership, and for the collection of fees and dues, for the election and appointment of its Directors and other officers, and to define their duties, and for the safekeeping and protection of its property and funds, and in general to regulate, manage and preserve its property and interests, and from time to time to alter, repeal, rescind or vary such constitution, by-laws, rules and regulations, or any of them.

To carry on any other business of the same or a similar nature which may seem to the corporation capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the corporations property or rights.

To acquire or undertake the whole, or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or corporation carrying on any business which the company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the corporation.

To take or otherwise acquire and hold shares in any other corporation having objects, altogether or in part, similar to those of the corporation.

To enter into any arrangements with any authorities, municipal, local or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the corporation's objects, or any of them, and to obtain from any such authority any rights, privileges and concessions which the corporation may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.

To purchase, take on lease, or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real or personal property, or any rights or privileges, which the corporation may think necessary or convenient for the purposes of its business.

To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes bills of exchange and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To sell or dispose of the underfaking of the corporation or any part thereof for

such consideration as the corporation may think fit, and in particular for shares debentures or securities of any other corporation, having objects altogether, or in part, similar to those of the corporation.

Providing for fees and dues, and the collection thereof.

The term of service, manner of selection and qualification of directors, and prescribing the powers exercisable by the directors, but no bye-law varying, diminishing or increasing the powers of directors shall be acted upon or have any force or effect till confirmed at a meeting of the members.

The time at which, and place where meeting of the directors and of the corporation shall be held, the calling of meetings of the directors, and of the corporation, the requirements as to proxies, and the procedure in all things at such meetings.

The imposition and recovery of all penalties and forfeitures, admitting of regulation of bye-laws.

The appointment of committees to manage the affairs of the corporation, and to pass, adopt and enforce rules and regulations therefor.

To conduct in all other particulars of the affairs of the corporation, and may from time to time repeal, amend or re-enact the same, but every such bye-law and every repeal, amendment or re-enactment thereof, unless in the meantime confirmed at a general meeting of the corporation duly called for that purpose, shall only have force until the next annual meeting of the corporation and in default of confirmation thereof, shall at and from that time only cease to have force, and in that case, no new bye-law to the same or the like effect or re-enactment thereof shall have any force until confirmed at a general meeting of the corporation.

Provided however, that the corporation shall have power either at a general meeting called as aforesaid or at the annual meeting of the corporation to repeal, amend, vary or otherwise deal with any bye-laws which have been passed by the directors, but no act done or right acquired under any bye-law shall be prejudicially affected by any such repeal, amendment, variation or other dealing, by the name of "Big Sevoogle Fishing Club, Limited", with a capital stock of Twenty-four thousand dollars divided into forty-eight shares of Five Hundred Dollars each, with the head office at Humphreys Mills, in the Parish of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.
