Pitt, Stenographer; all of the City of Saint John in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on business as manufacturers of and dealers in beers, mineral waters, soups, broths, syrups, flavorings, fluids, decoctions, beverages of all kinds, vinegar, acetic acid, glucose, yeast, aerated water, carbonic acid gas and condiments of all kinds.

To buy, sell and deal in fruits of all kinds, and to improve, treat and preserve fruits and manufacture fruits into syrups, flavorings, fluids and decoctions.

To manufacture, buy, sell, improve, treat, preserve, fine, aerate, mineralize, bottle and otherwise deal in mineral and aerated waters and other liquids of any description.
