THE NEW BRUNSWICK COMPANIES ACT 1916—Regulations and Tariff.

HIS HONOUR the Lieutenant-Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Order respecting the incor-poration of Companies by Letters Patent under The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916, and amendments thereto which is to take effect from the date hereof, and all previous Orlers and Regulations relat-ing thereto are rescinded:

1. The Honourable the Provincial Secretary is hereby designated as the Officer charged with the issue of Letters Patent and Supplementary Letters Patent; and the Department of the Honourable the Provincial Secretary as the Department through which such issue shall take

2. The signatures of the subscribers to the Petition for Letters Patent or Sup-plementary Letters Patent, or to the Memorandum of Association, shall be Memorandum of Association, shall be verified by affidavit to the satisfaction of the Provincial Secretary.

3. The following is the Schedule of Fees payable under the 93rd Section of the said Act:

(1) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$5,000 or less, the fee to be forty dollars (\$40.00).

(2) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is above \$5,000 and less than \$10,000, the fee to be fifty dollars (\$50.00).

(3) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$10,000 and less than \$25,000, the fee to be sixty-five dollars (\$65.00).

(4) When the proposed Capital Stock of the Company is \$25,000 and less than \$50,000, the fee to be eighty dollars (80.00). When the proposed Capital Stock

of the Company is \$50,000 and less than \$100,000, the fee to be one hun-dred dollars (\$100.00). (6) When the proposed Capital Stock

of the Company is \$100,000 and less than \$200,000, the fee to be one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00). (7) When the proposed Capital Stock
