

the said Company, and further to acquire and take over the stumpage rights on Four Hundred (400) acres of wilderness land situate in the County of Gloucester aforesaid which rights are now held by the said Charles H. Mitton and Horatio N. Mitton and to pay for the same in part with cash and in part with paid-up shares in the said Company.

To carry on in all its branches a lumber, timber and pulpwood business and to manufacture, produce, buy, sell and deal in timber, logs, lumber and wood of all kinds.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire real estate, lands, locations, surface rights, timber limits, woodlands and timberlands, water lots, river rights and government municipal or other rights, privileges, franchises, easements and licenses of all kinds, and to sell, dispose of, exchange or otherwise deal in the same.

To improve and develop rivers and lakes, and to construct and maintain reservoirs, canals, dams, embankments, booms, and other works and equipment of all kinds.

To construct, purchase or otherwise acquire steamers, barges, tugs, or any other kind of boat or craft for inland or ocean navigation, and to employ and operate the same.

To construct, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, basins, docks, jetties, piers, wharves, warehouses, elevators or other buildings capable of being used in connection with the business of the Company.

To construct and operate for the purpose of the Company's business, tramways and railways sidings on lands owned or controlled by the Company.

To purchase or lease or otherwise acquire and build and construct and maintain and operate lumber mills and saw mills, and to engage in the business of manufacturing and preparing for the market timber, lumber and wood of all kinds and descriptions.

To import, export, buy, sell and otherwise deal in lumber and wood of all kinds, and to manufacture and deal in articles of all kinds in the manufacture of which timber or wood are used.

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and build and construct and maintain and operate pulp and paper mills and to carry on generally the business of manufacturers, importers, exporters and dealers in pulp, paper and paper substitutes of all kinds, and descriptions and of the raw materials and substances of every kind, pulp, preparations, mixtures, chemicals, solvents and combinations used or capable of being used in connection with the said business.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, and to utilize and develop water powers and other power for the production of electric, pneumatic, hydraulic or other power or force, and to construct and operate works for the production of such power.

To engage in, conduct and carry on any other business whether manufacturing or otherwise which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights.

To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purpose of this Company.

To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire any patents, licenses, concessions and the like, conferring any exclusive or non-exclusive or limited rights to use or any secret or other information as to any inventions which may seem capable of being used for any of the purposes of the Company, or the acquisition of which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to benefit the Company, and to use, exercise, develop or grant licenses in respect of, or otherwise turn to account the property rights or information so acquired.

To take or otherwise acquire or hold shares in any other company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company or carrying on any business capable of being conducted on or directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

To acquire, take over and amalgamate the undertakings of any other Company doing the same or similar bus-

inesses as authorized to be done or carried out by this Company.

To purchase, take on lease or exchange, hire or otherwise acquire, any real or personal property and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for the purpose of its business and in particular any lands, buildings, easements, machinery, plant or stock-in-trade.

To draw, make, accept, endorse, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

To apply for, secure, acquire by assignment, transfer, purchase or otherwise and to execute, carry out and enjoy any charter, license, power, authority, franchise, concessions, rights or privileges, which any government or authority or any corporation or other public body may be empowered to grant and to pay for, aid in and contribute towards carrying the same into effect, and to appropriate any of the Company's bonds, shares and assets to defray the necessary costs, charges and expenses thereof.

To enter into any arrangement with any Governments or authorities, municipal, local or otherwise that may seem conducive to the Company's objects or any of them, and to obtain from any such government or authority, any rights, privileges or concessions which the Company may think it desirable to obtain and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.

To procure the Company to be registered and recognized in any foreign country and to designate persons therein according to the laws of such foreign country to represent this Company and to accept service for and on behalf of the Company of any process or suit.

To do any or all of the above things as principals, agents, contractors, trustees or otherwise and either alone or in conjunction with others.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, by the name of "Mitton Lumber Company, Limited", with a capital stock of Twenty-four thousand dollars divided into Two Hundred and Forty shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office at Bathurst in the County of Gloucester and Province of New Brunswick.

KING'S BENCH DIVISION.

in the Matter of the Fredericton Young Men's Christian Association, and in the matter of "The Quieting of Titles Act, 1923."

All parties having adverse claims to the Fredericton Young Men's Christian Association, a body corporate under and by virtue of an Act of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick with respect to:
