### HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

### RULES AND PRACTICE OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

The attention of parties intending to seek legislation at the next session of the Legislative Assembly is directed to the following Rules:

#### Private and Local Bills

77. A typewritten copy or printed copy of every Private Bill or Local Bill introduced into this House shall be filed with
