

above ground of electricity and electric light, heat, power or current through, under, over, along or across any public street, highway, bridge, watercourses and waters in and throughout the County of Carleton in the Province of New Brunswick outside the limits of the incorporated Town of Woodstock.

To generate, manufacture, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, electricity, electric light, heat, power, force or current, and to use, store, sell, lease, dispose of and distribute the same by the means mentioned in foregoing clause one for light, heat, power, and any and all commercial purposes within the limits of the said County of Carleton excepting the incorporated Town of Woodstock as aforesaid.

To manufacture, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, deal in, sell, lease or otherwise dispose of dynamos, motors, carbons, lamps, radio supplies and equipment, and electrical machinery, appliances and devices of every nature and description.

To carry on the business of wholesale and retail electricians and to conduct and maintain radio stations.

To construct, operate and maintain such telephone lines and other conveniences as may be required between the different buildings or works of the Company and between the buildings and works of the Company and other buildings or works supplied by the Company under the powers herein given.

To enter by its servants, agents and workmen upon any or all public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground, waterways, bridges or highways in any incorporated town, village or parish in said County of Carleton as aforesaid, and to break up, excavate and open the same for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and poles, stringing or maintaining wires and cables, placing or maintaining under ground, mains, pipes or conduits for any or all of the purposes aforesaid, and for renewing, replacing or repairing the same.

To acquire by original subscription, purchase or otherwise, and to hold, sell, pledge, mortgage or otherwise dispose of any securities of or other interests in any company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, assume or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person, partnership or Company carrying on any business which the Company hereby incorporated is authorized to carry on or similar thereto and subject to the consent of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, to amalgamate with any such Company.

To sell, lease, license or otherwise dispose of the undertakings of the Company or any part thereof, or any of the real or personal property, franchises, assets, rights or credits of the Company for such consideration as the Company may think fit.

To issue, allot, and hand over paid-up stock of the said Company in payment of right of way, plant, franchises, lands, powers, appurtenances and other property, and for the service of contractors, engineers and employees, and for any and all expenses in connection with the business of the Company, which stock shall be non-assessable and the issue and allotment thereof shall be binding on the Company.

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others.

To enter from time to time upon any public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground or highways in any city, town or parish and break up and open such public roads, streets, squares, plots of ground or highways, or any part thereof for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and poles and stringing and maintaining wires for electric purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same; and to place and maintain if the said Company sees fit, underground, along or across such public streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways, pipes or conduits for the purpose of carrying wires for motive power, heating or lighting purposes, and to renew and repair the same.

Before such Company shall break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and highways, the Company shall give previous notice of their intention so

to do in writing to the City or Town Council in any city or incorporated town, or to a supervisor or road commissioner in any parish or part of a parish in which it is proposed to break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and highways, and shall receive the consent in writing so to do of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner as the case may be and not otherwise.

That such Company shall and do, at their own proper cost and charges, and to the satisfaction of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner, and without unnecessary delay, repair and amend the said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground and highways, pavements, or sidewalks in every part where they shall be so broken up and opened as aforesaid to the condition to which they were before breaking up or opening the same.

No poles or wires or conduits shall be placed in such a way as to interfere with the poles or wires or conduits of any telephone, telegraph or electric light company now existing or so as to injure or impair the effective working of any telephone, telegraph or electric light system in operation in this Province in places where any such system may be in operation before such Company hereby incorporated establishes its system. It being understood, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent such Company hereby incorporated from erecting its poles or placing its conduits or stringing its wires or laying the same underground on the opposite side of any highway or street to that occupied by the poles or wires of any existing telephone, telegraph or electric light system.

Provided also that such corporation, its agent and workmen shall not in the execution of any of the power herein given, do or permit any unnecessary damage, nor shall they cut down or injure any fruit, shade or ornamental tree, nor in any way obstruct the entrance to any door or gateway, or place any post or pole directly opposite any window of any store, dwelling house, school house or place of divine worship or in any ditch of any street or highway.

Any poles used in any City, Town or Village by such Company shall be straight cedar poles of a reasonable size and of sufficient length that any wires placed thereon by such Company shall be not less than 20 feet above the ground, street, road or highway over which the same are placed, by the name of "Hartland Electric Company, Limited", with a capital stock of Twenty-four thousand nine hundred dollars divided into two hundred and forty-nine shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office at the Town of Hartland in the County of Carleton and Province of New Brunswick.

#### "HOTEL DUNLOP, LTD."

Public Notice is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Eighth day of December A. D. 1923, incorporating Laura V. Dunlop, Spinster; Wealthy A. Dunlop, Spinster; and Francis Kerr, Barrister-at-Law; all of the City of Saint John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To construct, build, purchase, lease, own, equip, maintain and operate, hotels, restaurants, cafes and refreshment rooms and sell, lease, supply, exchange or otherwise dispose of the same and generally to carry on in all its branches the business of building, owning, maintaining and operating hotels, restaurants, cafes, taverns, refreshment booths and lodging houses and, in connection therewith, to carry on the business of licensed victuallers, tobacco merchants, importers and manufacturers of aerated, mineral and artificial waters and other drinks, purveyors, caterers for public amusements generally, automobile, coach, cab and carriage proprietors, livery stable keepers, real estate agents, brokers, carriers and warehousemen.

To construct, erect, and operate hotels, apartments, dwelling houses, shops, factories, works, machinery, residences, boarding houses, laundries and places of amusements.

To generate, manufacture, produce, accumulate and use steam, gas, compressed air and electricity, and to sell or otherwise dispose of and supply the same for light, heat, and power purposes to the occupants of any hotel or other building owned or operated by the Company or as regards the surplus thereof not required therefor to any other persons, firms or corporations provided that the powers hereby conferred upon the Company shall when exercised outside the property of the Company be subject to provincial and municipal laws and regulations in that behalf.

To acquire, hold, lease, sell, exchange or otherwise dispose of the stock, bonds, debentures, securities or shares of or in any company carrying on business with objects similar to this Company.

To distribute among shareholders in kind and property or assets of the Company, and in particular any shares, debentures, or securities of any other companies belonging to or held by the Company of which the Company may have power to dispose of.

To invest any monies of the Company not immediately required in such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

To purchase and otherwise acquire and hold shares in the capital stock of any other corporation.

To remunerate whether by means of commission or otherwise, any persons or companies for subscribing to or agreeing to subscribe for any shares of the Company or any debentures, debenture stock or other securities of the Company, or for services rendered or to be rendered in placing or assisting to place or guaranteeing the placing of any shares of the Company or any debentures, debenture stock or other securities of the Company or in or about the information or promotion of the Company or the conduct of its business.

To issue and allot as fully or partly paid-up shares of the Company in payment or part payment of any business, franchise, undertaking, property, rights, powers, privileges, leases, licenses, contracts, real estate, stocks, bonds and debentures or other property or rights which it may lawfully acquire by virtue of the powers herein granted, or of any services rendered or to be rendered to the Company.

To amalgamate with or take over as a going concern or otherwise any company or business having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company on such terms and conditions as may be deemed advisable by the name of "Hotel Dunlop, Ltd." with a capital stock of Nine thousand nine hundred dollars divided into ninety nine shares of one hundred dollars each, with the head office at the City of Saint John in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
