Notice is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, at the next session thereof, for the passing of an Act, authorizing the Town of Bathurst to make an issue of debentures in a sum not exceeding twenty thousand dollars, for the purpose of installing fire alarm system, water meters and other necessary permanent works of the Town: Such debentures to be for \$500. each, and to be payable twenty years after date, and to bear interest at a rate not exceeding six per cent, payable semi-annually.
