By-Law regulating the traffic and the use of the roads or streets in the Village of Rothesay.

Whereas the Village of Rothesay by virtue of an Act of the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick, being Chapter 16, 12 George V. 1922, is authorized and empowered to make By-Laws and regulations to regulate the traffic and the use of the roads or streets in the village.

Therefore be it enacted as a By-law of the said Village as follows:

1. No person having charge of a motor vehicle shall drive same within the village, faster than at a rate of speed of twelve miles an hour.

2. Persons driving a motor vehicle on a by-road shall when approaching a main highway blow their horn and shall look out for traffic on the main highway. The highways known as the Hampton Post Road and the Gondola Point Road shall for the purposes of this by-law be deemed main highways, and the remaining roads, lanes or highways whether private or public, deemed by-roads.

3. Owners and operators of motor or other vehicles shall exercise all possible care not to injure pedestrians using said highways and shall sound their horn at all crossings.

4. The Village Council, shall have power to declare closed any and all streets, highways and lanes within the Village limits, to motor vehicle traffic or other heavy traffic between the fifteenth day of March and the fifteenth day of May in each year when said Council deem it desirable so to do, and notice of such declaration shall be posted at the entrances to such street, highway or lane.

5. Any and every person offending against any of the provisions or regulations of this By-law shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars and not less than ten dollars.

6. This By-law shall come into effect on the fifteenth day of May A. D. 1923. In witness whereof the Village of Rothesay has caused the Seal of the said Village to be hereunto affixed the day of May A. D. 1923.
