PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-first day of November, A. D. 1923, incorporating Murray Leonard Wright, Merchant; Lillian C. Wright, Married Woman; and Richard W. L. Earle, Physician; all of Perth, in the County of Victoria and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, deal in, produce and sell, at wholesale and retail, both as principal and agent, all kinds of agricultural products, horses, cattle and other live stock, goods, wares, merchandise, fertilizers, farm implements, machinery, carriages, waggon, sleds, sleds, meats and food stuffs, automobiles and automobile parts, repairs and accessories, and to carry on a general mercantile and trading business and to buy, sell and deal in all kinds of goods and classes of goods incidental thereto.

To carry on any other business (whether manufacturing or otherwise) which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently and profitably carried on in connection with the above or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

For the purposes aforesaid, to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire real estate and buildings, and to build, purchase, own and operate starch factories, warehouses, grist mills, saw mills, barrel

and box factories, dwelling houses and stores.
