PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916" and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick bearing date the Fourth day of January, A. D. 1922, incorporating Matthew Cabot Lodge, Agent; of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; George Jephtha Ross, Manufacturer; of the City of Sydney, in the Province of Nova Scotia; and Ivan C. Hand, Barrister; of the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes namely:

To purchase, take on lease, or otherwise acquire mines, quarries and deposits of salt, lime, limestone, dolomite, gypsum, sulphur, petroleum and allied substances, or any constituent, product, or by-product thereof, or any mineral compound or mixture containing any of the said minerals or substances, or any mineral substance capable of being conveniently or profitably developed, exploited, or turned to account in connection or along with any of the foregoing minerals, compounds or substances or any rights, powers, privileges, licenses, concessions or other interest whatsoever in respect thereof;

To explore, search, bore and sink wells for, win, work, exercise, develop, produce, manufacture, refine, work, distribute, sell, dispose of, deal in, and carry on the business of manufacturers, refiners, producers, and dealers in, all or any of the said minerals, products, by-products, compounds, mixtures or other substances and otherwise howsoever turn the same to account;

To buy, acquire, sell, exchange, manufacture, produce or otherwise acquire and deal in mining claims, mineral rights, mines, minerals, plant, machinery, implements, conveniences, provisions and all other things, materials or substances capable of being or required to be used in connection with the operations of or required by workmen or others employed by the Company.

To build, construct, purchase, lease, hire or otherwise acquire or provide, carry out, maintain, improve, manage, work, control and superintend roads, ways, tramways, railways, bridges, reservoirs, water courses, aqueducts, wharves, furnaces, mills, crushing works, hy-

draulic works, factories, warehouses, buildings, offices, workshops, plant, machinery and all other works and conveniences required for the purposes of or which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to or useful in carrying out any of the objects of the Company;

To contribute to, subsidize or otherwise aid or take part in any operations;

To construct, install, maintain and operate lines of telephone, telegraph or other means of communication which may be conveniently used or carried on in connection with or may be required for the work or objects of the Company;

To buy, grow, take on lease or otherwise acquire, sell, cut, produce, manufacture, and otherwise deal in wood, timber, lumber, woodlands, timber limits, concessions and lands suitable for the growth of timber;

To carry on the business of lumbermen, saw-mill proprietors, timber growers, and millwrights;

To manufacture, prepare for, market and deal in articles and products of all kinds in the manufacture of which wood is used.

To purchase, take on lease or otherwise acquire or to build, manufacture and produce, and to maintain and operate, steam and sailing ships, vessels and boats of every nature and kind, together with all materials, articles, tools, machinery, appliances, engines, boilers, machinery and appurtenances of all kinds, tackle, apparel and furniture entering into or suitable and convenient for the construction or equipment thereof, as may be required or useful for the transportation of the materials, substances, goods, articles and products used, produced, required or dealt in by the Company;

To acquire or build, repair, maintain and operate, wharves, docks, dry docks, machinery, equipment and any other property, interest or thing that may be required or can be profitably or conveniently used in connection therewith;

To make, produce, manufacture, buy or otherwise acquire and sell or otherwise dispose of any article, substance, material, matter or thing required in or that can conveniently or profitably be used in connection with or incidentally to the carrying on of the business or objects of the Company;

To buy, lease, make, build, construct or otherwise acquire sidings, tramways, railways, motor or steam driven or other vehicles or means or agencies of transportation and to use, maintain and operate the same for the purposes or objects of the Company;

To procure the Company to be registered, licensed or otherwise recognized in any other Province of Canada or in any country and to designate and to appoint persons therein as attorneys or representatives of the Company with full power to represent it in all manner according to the laws of such Province or foreign country, and to accept service for or on behalf of the Company for any process or suit;

To issue and allot as fully or partly paid-up shares of the Company in payment or in part payment of any property, moveable or immovable, rights, leases, franchises, under-takings, powers, privileges, licenses, concessions, stocks, shares, bonds, debentures, debenture stocks, or other property which the Company is authorized to acquire or hold.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and undertake all or any of the assets, business, property, privileges, contracts, rights, obligations or liabilities of any Company, partnership, association or person carrying on all or any part of the business, or holding any property, rights, interests or other assets which the Company is authorized to carry on or acquire, or possessed of property rights or interests suitable for the purposes of the Company, and to pay for the same in cash or in shares of the Company, or partly in cash or partly in shares;

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, or otherwise acquire and hold, all real and personal property necessary, useful or convenient for the purposes of the Company, and to sell, lease, exchange, dispose of, turn to account, or otherwise deal with the same;

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects;

The powers of each paragraph hereof, shall be in nowise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other paragraph, by the name of "The North Atlantic Salt and Chemical Company, Limited", with a capital stock of Four Hundred and Ninety-Nine Thousand Dollars divided into Four Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the head Office at the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.
