### "THE KOUCHIBOUGUACIS FISHING CLUB, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1914, and Amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Third day of December, A. D. 1922, incorporating James R. Burns, Telegrapher; William D. Charters, Merchant; and Ivan C. Rand, Barrister; all of the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick; for the following purposes, namely:

To engage in and carry out the objects, purposes and activities of a fishing hunting and recreation club.

To buy, lease, or otherwise acquire, sell, exchange, transfer, sub-let in whole or part, or otherwise dispose of, or in any other manner deal with, estates, rights, privileges and interests of every kind of, in, to and in respect of fishing and hunting in, at or over any streams, rivers, lakes, waters, fishing grounds, lands, woodlands, forest lands, or other places whatsoever, within the Province of New Brunswick.

To purchase, take on lease or in exchange, acquire, hold, mortgage, sell and convey any real or personal property and any rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for its purposes.

To erect buildings, club houses, or other improvements of any kind on any lands owned or possessed by the Company.

To promote the improvement and enrichment of fisheries in which the Company is interested in any manner the Company may consider proper.

To distribute the whole or any part of the property or assets of the Company in specie or money among its shareholders, provided, however, that no such distribution shall effect a reduction of the capital of the Company, except made in accordance with the New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1914.

To pay all costs, charges, expenses, incurred or sustained in or about the promotion or establishment of the Company, or which the Company shall consider preliminary.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects.

The powers in each paragraph hereof, shall be in nowise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other paragraph, by the name of "The Kouchibouguacis Fishing Club, Limited", with a capital stock of Twenty-four Thousand Dollars divided into Two Hundred and Forty Shares of One Hundred Dollars Each, with the head office at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.

The shares of the capital stock of the

Company shall not be transferred to any person not then being a shareholder of the Company until the name of the proposed transferee has been submitted for the approval of the existing shareholders, and approved in such manner as may be prescribed by the by-laws of the Company.
