Licenses to expire on the first of August 1924 but subject to renewal to 1st August, 1923, in accordance with Chapter XI, 3 George V, 1913, for Saw Mill Licenses of the following applications for Timber Berths, for the purpose of cutting all classes of lumber, will be sold at this office at noon on Thursday the 9th day of August, 1923, at noon.
