Letters Patent Granted

"CARLETON ELECTRIC COMPANY, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies' Act, 1916," and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Sixteenth day of October, A. D. 1923, incorporating Heber H. Hatfield, Produce Dealer; of Hartland, in the County of Carleton and Province of New Brunswick; Wilnot F. Anderson, Merchant; of Lakeville, in the County of Carleton and Province aforesaid; Edgar R. Teed, Trader; of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton and Province aforesaid; Charles F. Gallagher, Merchant of Bath in the County of Carleton and

Province aforesaid; and Frank B. Carvell, Barrister-at-Law; of Ottawa, in the Province of Ontario; for the following purposes, namely:

To buy, generate, sell, lease, use or otherwise dispose of electricity, for lighting, heating, communicating power and mechanical purposes, and any and all other such purposes, and to carry on the business of electricians, workers and dealers in electricity, motive power and light.

To buy, sell and generally deal in electrical supplies and machinery of all kinds.

To enter from time to time upon any public streets, roads, squares, open plots of ground or highways in any city, town or parish, and break up and open such public roads, streets, squares, plots of ground or highways, or any part thereof for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles, and posts and stringing and maintaining wires for electric purposes, and for renewing and repairing the same; and to place and maintain if the said Company sees fit, underground, along or across such public streets, roads, squares, plots of ground or highways, pipes or conduits for the purpose of carrying wires for motive power, heating or lighting purposes, and to renew and repair the same.

Before such Company shall break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and highways, the Company shall give previous notice of their intention so to do in writing to the City or Town Council in any city or incorporated town, or to a supervisor or road commissioner in any parish or part of a parish in which it is proposed to break up and open any part of said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground, bridges and highways, and shall receive the consent in writing so to do of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner as the case may be and not otherwise.

That such Company shall and do, at their own proper cost and charges, and to the satisfaction of such City or Town Council or supervisor or road commissioner, and without unnecessary delay, repair and amend the said roads, streets, squares, open plots of ground and highways, pavements, or side-walks in every part where they shall be so broken up and opened as aforesaid to the condition to which they were before breaking up or opening the same.

No poles or wires or conduits shall be placed in such a way as to interfere with the poles or wires or conduits of any telephone, telegraph or electric light company now existing or so as to injure or impair the effective working of any telephone, telegraph or electric light system in operation in this Province in places where any such system may be in operation before such Company hereby incorporated establishes its system, it being understood, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent such Company hereby incorporated from erecting its poles or placing its conduits or stringing its wires or laying

the same underground on the opposite side of any highway or street to that occupied by the poles or wires of any existing telephone, telegraph or electric light system.

Provided also that such corporation, its agents and workmen shall not in the execution of any of the powers herein given, do or permit any unnecessary damage, nor shall they cut down or injure any fruit, shade or ornamental tree, nor in any way obstruct the entrance to any door or gateway, or place any post or pole directly opposite any window of any store, dwelling house, school house or place of divine worship or in any ditch of any street or highway.

Any poles used in any City, Town or Village by such Company shall be straight cedar poles of a reasonable size and of sufficient length that any wires placed thereon by such Company shall be not less than 20 feet above the ground, street, road or highway over which the same are placed.

To acquire by purchase and conveyance, lease or otherwise, all such lands, buildings or real estate, works, machinery, plant, equipment and appliances as might be necessary or deemed advisable for the purposes of the Company and the carrying out of its objects, and to construct, build, erect and maintain, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and operate works, buildings, machinery, poles, wires and all such plant, equipment and appliances as may be necessary, usual or expedient for the objects of the Company.

To acquire the whole or any part of the business, property, assets, rights and liabilities of any person or Company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of the Company.

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors or otherwise, and either alone or in conjunction with others, by the name of "Carleton Electric Company, Limited", with a Capital stock of Ninety Nine Thousand Dollars divided into Nine Hundred and Ninety Shares of One Hundred Dollars each, with the head-office at the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton in the Province of New Brunswick.
