To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over as a going concern and carry on in all or any of its branches the Foundry Machine Works and Ship repairing business and undertaking presently carried on at Chatham by the said Frederick M. Tweedie under the name and style of "Miramichi Foundry & Machine Works" with any and all real and personal estate and property in connection therewith.
