WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday the Second day of August instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday, the Twentieth day of September next.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the First day of August, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, and in the Fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign.

GOVERNMENT NOTICES.

Having received a certified copy of a By-law passed by the Village of Port Elgin, a Village duly incorporated under the provisions of Chapter 56 of the Acts of Assembly, 19 George V., 1920, "The Villages Incorporation Act", which said by-law reads as follows:

By-law No. 28—Ordered that twenty-five year, coupon bearing bonds at five and one half per centum per annum, be issued and sold by the Village of Port Elgin, N. B., to the amount of Ten thousand dollars, and that the money realized by such issue and sale be used to purchase and install a plant to supply light for said Village, and acquiring land within the Village on which to erect a powerhouse."

And having also received a certified copy of the Notice provided for in section 142 of the said Act and a statutory declaration proving the posting of such Notice and that a poll has not been demanded and also showing the total value of assessable real property in the Village as shown by the last revised assessment roll thereof:

And I being satisfied that the several conditions required by the said Act have been substantially complied with, I do hereby authorize the Council of the said Village to borrow by way of debenture, the sum of money mentioned in the said By-law, to be used for the purpose mentioned in said By-law.

Scribner, Accountant, all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To engage in a general business as Hardware Merchants, including the purchase and sale at wholesale and retail of all kinds of hardware, tools and implements, glass, leads, paints, oils, granite ware, crockery ware, tinware, and fishing tackle, fire arms and sporting goods of every kind and description.
