Public Notice is hereby given that at next Session of the Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick, applilcation will be made on behalf of The New Brunswick Pharmaceutical Society to amend and consolidate The Pharmacy Act, being Chapter 74, of the Consoli-dated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903,

and amendments thereto, by authorizing. (a) The holding by the Society of real and personal property not to exceed \$25,000 in value.

(b) The examination, licensing and registration of Certified Clerks and the defining of their powers and privileges.

(c) The registration and licensing of corporations engaged in the business of druggists, of branch and second stores by members of the Society of Pharmaceutical Chemists employ-ed or proposed to be employed thereby or therein, and of the places of business of such corporations and of members of the Society.

(d) The increase of fees to be paid by persons registered under the Act.
(e) That laboratories in which drugs and medicines are compounded for sale, shall be under the personal supervision of a Registered Chemist.

(f) Increasing the penalty for offences under the Act.
