LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

"NEW BRUNSWICK PUBLISHING COMPANY, LIMITED"

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that under "The New Brunswick Companies Act, 1916", and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the seal of the Provincial Secretary-Treasurer of the Province of New Brunswick, bearing date the Twenty-ninth day of June, A. D. 1923, incorporating Peter J. Hughes, Barrister; of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; S. Winifred Staples, Stenographer; of the Parish of Douglas, in the County and Province aforesaid; and Jean S. Hagerman, Accountant; of the City of Fredericton, in the County and Province aforesaid; for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of printing, publishing, engraving, lithographing, book binding, stereotyping, electrotyping, syndication, and any business of a similar nature, and to do anything incidental to the trade of printing and publishing.

To print, publish and sell newspapers, books, magazines, periodicals, pamphlets, advertisements and other publications, and to act as agents for the printing, publishing and sale of the same for others.

To acquire by purchase or otherwise, and dispose of the copyright of any book, article, story, engraving or other publication which may be copyrighted.

To prepare or acquire by purchase or otherwise and dispose of any literary, scientific or artificial works, transactions or compositions, and syndicate articles with simultaneous publication or otherwise, and special or syndicate manuscripts or telegraphic correspondence.

To act as special agents for syndicates, publishers and printers, and to supply general news articles by telegraph or otherwise to newspapers.

To manufacture, buy, sell, or dispose of otherwise, ready prints, patents, plates, bases, type, printing machinery or any other machinery for use in printing establishments.

To buy or otherwise acquire newspapers, periodicals and magazines, machinery, good-will, stock, and other things required for the business of the Company.

To purchase and acquire any business of a similar nature, and to purchase and acquire any interest or control in any business of a similar nature, and to pay for same in cash or shares in this Company.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, and to hold property, both real and personal, moveable and immovable, which may be deemed necessary and rebuilding, apparatus, plant and machinery requisite for the purpose of the Company's business, and to sell, lease or dispose of the same in whole or in part.

To acquire and take over the business

or assets of any company or going concern having objects similar in whole or in part to the foregoing purposes, and all or part of the assets of the said Company or concern and the good-will thereof, and to pay therefor either in cash or in fully paid-up and non-assessable shares or securities of the Company or otherwise.

Without limiting the extent of any of the foregoing provisions, to possess and exercise all and any of the powers mentioned and set out in Act of Assembly 8 George V. Chapter 35, Section 2, by the name of "New Brunswick Publishing Company Limited," with a capital stock of six hundred thousand dollars, divided into six thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, of which three thousand shall be eight per cent preference shares of one hundred dollars each, and three thousand shall be common or ordinary shares of one hundred dollars each. The said preference shares shall confer on the holder a right to a cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of eight per cent per annum and shall upon the winding up of the Company have priority as to return of the capital and payment of all arrears of dividend, whether declared or not, and shall further have priority as to the return of capital over all other shares of the capital stock for the time being of the Company upon such winding up, dissolution, bankruptcy or otherwise, the said preference shares shall be subject to the right of the Company to redeem same upon payment to the owner or owners thereof of the sum of one hundred and ten dollars per share for each and every share, with the head office at the City of St. John, in the County of the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
