Ordered on the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Health, that the following amendments to Regulations under the Public Health Act, 1918, be approved and adopted:

Medical Inspection of Schools
Regulation 146 is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:

"176. For the purpose of Medical Inspection of Schools, it shall be the duty of the Minister of Health to divide the province into Medical School Inspection areas in such a manner as to him, from time to time, may appear right and expedient, and the province, accordingly, is divided as follows:

No. of Area, I: Limits of Area, Counties of Madawaska, Restigouche, Gloucester; Residence of Inspector, Campbellton.

No. of Area, II: Limits of Area, Counties of Northumberland, Kent, Westmorland (exclusive of City of Moncton); Residence of Inspector, Moncton.

No. of Area, III: Limits of Area, Cities

and Town, Moncton, Fredericton, St. Stephen; Residence of Inspector, Fredericton.

No. of Area, IV: Limits of Area, Counties of Albert, Kings, Queens, Charlotte (exclusive of Town of St. Stephen); Residence of Inspector, Sussex.

No. of Area, V: Limits of Area, Counties of Sunbury, York, Carleton, Victoria; Residence of Inspector, Woodstock.

No. of Area, VI: Limits of Area, St. John City and County; Residence of Inspector, St. John.

Regulation 177 is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:

"177. In each such area there shall be appointed by the Minister of Health, a Medical Inspector of Schools who shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner of the province and who shall be paid a yearly fixed sum from the funds of the Government of New Brunswick for his services. Such Inspector shall engage in no other gainful occupation or service while holding such office."

Regulation 178 is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:

"178. Each such Medical School Inspector shall be subject to the immediate direction and control of the Chief Medical Officer and shall be subject to suspension by the said Officer for grave dereliction of duty or for such other cause or causes as shall seem just and meet by said Officer. Such suspension shall remain in full effect from the time imposed until relieved or otherwise adjudicated by the Minister of Health, or by the Executive Council of the Province."

Regulation 179 is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:

"179. In the matter of rural schools, it shall be the duty of each Medical School Inspector to render a yearly report as soon as may be, after the close of the second school term in each year to the Chief Medical Officer, setting forth the number of schools and children examined, with the names of the respective teachers, the number and nature of the defects discovered, physical and mental, the number of children affected with communicable disease and the nature of such disease, the disposition of such cases of defect and disease, the results therefrom of such disposition, and generally, such other information as may be called for by the schedule laid down by the Minister and as may be deemed expedient to be obtained, by the Chief Medical Officer."

"In the matter of Urban Schools like reports shall be submitted in like manner and under like conditions each half year, that is to say, upon the close of each school term."

Regulation 180 is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor:

"180. In addition to such reports there shall be transmitted to the Chief Medical Officer upon the close of each month during which schools are in operation, a report or reports setting forth the names of the children found to have physical de-
