The Great War Veterans' Association of Canada, Incorporated, as may be deemed expedient, by the name of "Fredericton Great War Veterans' Association, Limited", having No Capital Stock or issuing any Share Certificates, with the head Office at the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick.
